CERTAMEN REPORT

Mitch Arnold, Flint Hill School



Report on Virginia State Certamen Team - NJCL Convention at Emory University July-August 2014.

Novice: As we mourn how close we were to our goal, let us not forget how far we have come.

Intermediate: When opposing new adversaries we often find that we have triumphed over old ones.

Advanced: It is anyone's day, but the past four days were ours.

The 2014 Nation Junior Classical League Convention saw the three Certamen teams from Virginia hold their own against the best teams and players in the nation. As for Virginia, the best Grammarians, Historians, Mythologists, and All-around players earned their places on the Novice, Intermediate, and Advanced level teams. When it came time to test their mettle, the three Virginia teams separated into their respective levels to compete with teams from other states. The Virginia Novice team, coached by Latin teacher Brandy Henricks and led by captain Arjun from Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology, made an impressive debut as a powerful Certamen entity on the national level. Although they barely fell short of the Final Round, they made quite the impression on all other state delegations, as I myself have heard. The Virginia Intermediate team, with the coaching of Latin teacher Adam Williams, also turned a lot of heads with their Certamen performance at NJCL convention. This foursome of four-midable Latin scholars, led by captain Mitch from Flint Hill School, struggled to find traction in the first round against Georgia and California. However, this funk would not last, as the Intermediate team came out of their second round having devastated the Florida state team, fierce rivals of Virginia who had trumped us at the previous NJCL convention. Although the Intermediate team's overall goal was to triumph over Georgia in the Finals, and this dream was unfortunately not realized, they nevertheless beat Florida by a margin greater than Florida's score (more than one hundred points). The Advanced Virginia team was spectacular. Led by Owen Hoffman from Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology, and coached by Latin teacher Howard Chang, the Advanced team utterly eclipsed every team they encountered on their path to the Finals. It was truly mirabile visu. Rival states such as Illinois, Florida, and Massachusetts (even with the Legendary Punjabi) found themselves at a loss for points in the wake of Virginia's Advanced Certamen



team. Unfortunately, Virginia did not conquer the Finals, and suffered a loss at the hands of a newly invigorated Massachusetts team. Due respect must be afforded to the Massachusetts team; they played most admirably. To the Novice team from Virginia, I would say this: as you mourn how close you came to our goal, may you not forget how far you have come. You all have caused tremors in the national Certamen community, regardless of your rank among the other teams. Be proud of your progress; the whole of the Virginia delegation certainly was. For the Intermediate team, I would like to entertain an idea. When opposing new adversaries, we often find that we have triumphed over old ones. In your enterprise to surpass the Georgia state team, you unknowingly overtook the Florida team. This warrants mighty pride, Intermediate team. You have come farther than you originally imagined, and Virginia hopes to see you soar even higher. For the Advanced team, I know that the 2014 NJCL convention was, for many of you, your last one as JCLers. Do not regret the outcome. Your performance throughout the tournament brought indescribable pride to the hearts of all Virginians, and we were truly honored to hail from the same state and the same schools as you. Sherry Lee, Owen Hoffman, Ben Hillman, Will Siegmund, and Charlie Shen, on behalf of all of Virginia, I would like to dedicate an in-text round of applause to you. You earned it. For all spectators, readers, etc. I encourage you to come to as many NJCL conventions as you can, to cheer for our state teams as they represent the state of Virginia so well, just as they have for years. Please come out; you will not regret it!
