

The national Junior Classical League sponsors thousands of dollars every year to be awarded to outstanding and admirable students of the NJCL every single year. Typically, scholarship deadlines are every February and are announced at the NJCL convention in the summer (attendance is not an application requirement). The VJCL encourages Virginia Latin students to apply to the following NJCL scholarships.

- 1.) NJCL Scholarships (ten awards between \$1200-4000 available),
- 2.) NJCL Latin & Greek Honor society scholarship (one award of **\$2000 i**s made out to an aspiring classics major and teaching career)
- 3.) National Latin Exam Scholarships (twenty \$1000 scholarships available to exceling students on National Latin Exams).
